Most students with visual impairments attend regular public schools, with the vast majority in general education classes. Itinerant vision services are generally provided, with the general education teachers and other related service providers responsible for addressing student needs for most of the school day.

This workshop will address the needs of visually impaired students in the educational setting. Common eye conditions and their specific implications for instruction will be discussed. In addition, the session will review curricular modifications and adaptations used to address specific visual impairments, vision specific technologies, compensatory strategies and an overview of braille. Strategies for developing independence and self-advocacy skills will also be discussed.

This session is applicable to general and special education teachers, related service providers, and teacher aides/assistants. Since many of the curricular adaptations are also applicable to students with other disabilities, educators working with other students are welcome to attend.

Dawn currently serves as the Curriculum Teacher for Nassau BOCES, in addition to teaching students.
